Advice Letter No. 542

TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Del Oro Water Company, Inc., hereby transmits for filing on behalf of its River Island District (DOWCRI), Advice Letter No. 542, requesting approval to activate Stage 4 in its Schedule No. 14.1 Water Shortage Contingency Plan.

PURPOSE

To request activation of a new stage, DOWC's Tariff Rule 14.1(F)(2) requires DOWC to meet one of the following:

- A. DOWC, the California Public Utilities Commission, wholesale water supplier, or other Government agency declares an emergency requiring mandatory water budgets, Mandatory water rationing, or mandatory water allocations; or
- B. A government agency declares a state of emergency in response to severe drought conditions, earthquake, or other catastrophic event that severely reduces DOWC's water supply; or
- C. Water supplies are projected to be insufficient to meet normal customer demand By DOWC; or
- D. A water supply shortage or threatened shortage exists: or
- E. DOWC is unable to achieve water conservation targets set by itself or a governing Agency; or
- F. Water conservation targets set by itself or a governing agency are insufficient; or
- G. DOWC chooses to subsequently activate a different stage of its Schedule No. 14.1 tariff.

DOWC's Tariff Rule 14.1 requires DOWC to include in its Tier 1 filing:

- Provide a justification for activating the particular stage of Staged Mandatory Reductions and Drought Surcharges, as well as the period during which the particular stage will be in effect. (Rule 14.1(F)(3)(A))
- Notify its customers and provide each customer with a summary of Schedule No. 14.1 by means of bill insert or direct mailing. (Rule 14.1(F)(5)(B))



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DISCUSSION

Schedule 14.1 provides information on mandatory restrictions, water allocations, enforcement measures and surcharges that will help to achieve reductions due to water supply shortages or to achieve identified water usage goals established by an authorized government agency or official.

On March 10, 2023, catastrophic flooding of the Tule River and creeks around the River Island District caused washout of land, mainlines on the north side of the bridge and the loss of five wells. Two wells were destroyed on state lands and cannot be replaced due to Success Dam Expansion. Three wells are awaiting rehabilitation which includes pumping, testing, and electrical panel repairs.

With the loss of five wells and hotter temperature causing extra demand on the system as customers began watering outdoors, and DOWC requested conservation with a May 22, 2023 posting on our web site.

“May 22, 2023: Del Oro is asking all customers to voluntarily conserve to maintain adequate water service for all customers due to the damage to our water system sustained in this year's flooding combined with the hotter temperatures this year. Please refrain from outdoor watering as much as possible.”

On June 22, 2023, DOWC mailed out a voluntary Staged Restriction Notice requesting the customers' assistance in water conservation efforts.

Over the July 4th, 2023 weekend, all available wells were running at least twenty-one hours a day with a one hour break every seven hours during this time. It is becoming extremely difficult for the current sources to meet the demand without Stage 2 restrictions and Stage 3 activation to follow if outside demands are not reduced or curtailed.

In order to achieve the water conservation goals needed to ensure reliable supplies of water for necessary use, DOWC requested activation of Stage 2 in its Schedule No. 14.1 Water Shortage Contingency Plan on July 6, 2023.

On August 15, 2023, meters were read and the total cubic usage for 381 customers in Territory One was recorded at 1,162,940 cubic feet. The July total usage for the same customers was recorded at 1,135,419 cubic feet. With the activation of Stage 2, customers still used 27,521 cubic feet more.



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Due to the continued high usage, DOWC is requesting activation of Stage 4 in its Scheduled No. 14.1 Water Shortage Contingency Plan. Immediately the top users will be mailed 1st Notice of Violation due to not achieving the 20% requested reduction. If reduction is not achieved, water restrictors will be installed on these customers' meters. Mandatory water usage budgets will be calculated if reductions are not complied with.

DOWC will be contacting the customers that did conserve the requested 20% and thank them for their help in achieving our goal.

SUMMARY OF STAGE 4 LIMITATIONS

In Stage 2, "Irrigating ornamental landscape with potable water is prohibited during the hours between 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m." For Stage 4, the restriction is more stringent stating "Irrigating ornamental landscapes with potable water is limited to no more than two (2) days per week" as well as prohibited during the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. The irrigation day restrictions are based on street address number where even-numbered addresses may irrigate on Tuesdays and Saturdays; odd-numbered addresses may irrigate on Wednesday and Sundays; and locations without a street address may irrigate on Tuesdays and Saturdays. Mandatory water usage budgets will be calculated and may be enforced.

REQUESTED EFFECTIVE DATE

DOWC is submitting this as a Tier 1 Advice Letter pursuant to Rule 14.1(F)(2) effective immediately upon approval.

NOTICE AND SERVICE

By way of mail and electronic submission, all customers and interested parties will be notified of the requested Scheduled 14.1, Stage 4 imposed restrictions. **[Exhibit A]**

FILE A PROTEST:

A protest is a document stating that you object to the utility receiving all or some part of its request. If you wish to file a protest, you must state the facts constituting the grounds for the protest, how the advice letter affects you, and the reasons why you believe the whole advice letter, or part of it, is not justified. If the protest requests an evidentiary hearing (an evidentiary hearing is a legal proceeding held before an administrative law judge at the Commission to obtain evidence), your protest must state the facts you would present at the evidentiary hearing to support your request for a complete or a partial denial of the advice letter. The filing of a protest does not ensure that an evidentiary hearing will be held. The decision whether or not to hold an evidentiary hearing will be based on the contents of the protest.

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FILE A RESPONSE:

A response is a document that does not object to the request sought in the application, but nevertheless, presents information you believe would be useful to the Commission in acting on the application.

Whether you wish to file a PROTEST or send a RESPONSE you must:

- Send a copy of your document to the utility.
- Mail both one copy to the utility and one copy to CPUC within twenty (20) days of the date you received this notice.

Notice of **STAGE 4 MANDATORY** Water Conservation and Restrictions
Including Restricted Watering Days

Del Oro Water filed an Advice Letter No. 542 with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to activate Stage 4 in its Schedule 14.1 Water Shortage Contingency Plan with Staged Mandatory Reductions and Drought Surcharges.

Many of Del Oro Water River Island's customers failed to meet the Stage 2 Restrictions during the month of mid-July to mid-August. Usage did not meet the 20% reduction target. Del Oro Water is REQUIRING its customers' assistance in water conservation efforts below. Failure to comply will result in continued daily outages and require mandatory water usage budgets in the future days. Effective immediately, the highest users will be receiving a written notice of their First Violation as they have not reduced usage by 20%. If requested reduction is not achieved, water restrictors will be installed on customers' meters.

Two additional Stages are left to be activated and they are Stage 5 – outside watering limited to one day per week, and Stage 6 – no outside watering. We are trying to not go to the more stringent California Public Commission-approved Stages.

Del Oro Water Company, River Island District is required to observe **Schedule 14.1 Stage 4** restrictions:

- **Customers are limited to outside watering to two (2) days per week. Irrigation is prohibited during the hours between 8:00 am and 6:00 pm.** Please see the back of this notice for your watering days.

Customers are required to observe the Schedule 14.1 Stage 4 restrictions as shown on the back of this notice. Schedule 14.1 is available on DOWC's website at: www.delorowater.com/schedule14.1.html

Please remember that the following are ALWAYS prohibited:

- The application of potable water to landscapes in a manner that causes runoff to other areas
- The use of a hose that dispenses potable water to wash any vehicles, aircraft, or trailers, except where the hose is fitted with an automatic shut-off nozzle
- Using broken or defective plumbing or irrigation after DOWC has notified you to repair it
- Using outdoor irrigation during and 48 hours following measurable precipitation
- Using potable water in decorative water features that do not recirculate the water
- Using potable water to wash sidewalks & driveways

Del Oro will continue to notify customers (usually via a door tag) as soon as we are aware of any leaks that are the customer's responsibility to repair. As per drought requirements, customers will have only **two (2) business days to repair leaks**, unless other arrangements are made with DOWC.

Please visit www.delorowater.com/drought.html to report waste of water, and for the most current information about prohibited water uses, other unauthorized water uses, and mandatory outdoor irrigation restrictions, as well as conservation resources. We encourage you to take advantage of the many conservation resources available on our website to save water.

MOBILE HOME PARKS and OTHER PROPERTY MANAGEMENT: Please share this information with residents who may not have received this notice directly. You can do this by posting this public notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.

DOWC recommends posting the restrictions list somewhere you will see it daily (such as your refrigerator).

Schedule 14.1 Stage 4 Water Restrictions



1. Outdoor Irrigation Restrictions

Irrigating ornamental landscapes with potable water is limited to no more than **two (2) days per week** as follows:

- Customers with **even**-numbered addresses may irrigate on **Tuesdays** and **Saturdays**
- Customers with **odd**-numbered addresses may irrigate on **Wednesdays** and **Sundays**
- Customers **without** a street address may irrigate on **Tuesdays** and **Saturdays**
- Hand and drip watering may be done at any time.

2. Irrigation is prohibited during the hours between 8:00 am and 6:00 pm.

3. Obligation to Fix Leaks, Breaks or Malfunctions

All leaks, breaks, or other malfunctions in the customer's plumbing fixtures and/or irrigation system must be repaired within **two (2) business days** of written notification by DOWC, unless other arrangements are made with DOWC. "Written notification" includes door tags.

4. Prohibited Uses of Water

- The application of potable water to driveways and sidewalks
- The use of potable water in a water feature, except where the water is part of a recirculating system
- The application of potable water to outdoor landscapes during and within forty-eight (48) hours after measurable rainfall
- The serving of drinking water other than upon request in eating or drinking establishments, including but not limited to restaurants, hotels, cafes, cafeterias, bars, or other public places where food or drink are served and/or purchased
- Irrigation outside of newly constructed buildings with potable water in a manner inconsistent with regulations

5. Other duly adopted restrictions on the use of potable water as prescribed from time to time by the Commission or other authorized government agencies may be added at any time.
