ANNUAL TREATMENT PLANT OFFLINE NOTIFICATION

Notice of STAGE 3 Mandatory Water Conservation and Restrictions
Including Restricted Watering Days

Effective **Thursday March 19, 2026 through Sunday April 12, 2026** the Pleasant Valley Canal Company (PVCC) supplying our Treatment Plant is required under the Tule River Authority, Region 5 of the California State Water Resources Control Board, to curtail access from the Tule River for twenty days annually. During this time, the canal will be shut down for the PVCC to perform maintenance to ensure that the quality of our raw treatment water and their waterways are safe.

Schedule 14.1 Stage 3 Water Restrictions

1. Outdoor Irrigation Restrictions

Irrigating ornamental landscapes with potable water is limited to no more than **three (3) day per week** as follows:

- a. **Customers with even-numbered addresses may irrigate on Saturday, Tuesday & Thursday**
- b. **Customers with odd-numbered addresses may irrigate on Sunday, Wednesday & Friday**
- c. Hand and drip watering may be done at any time.

2. Irrigation is prohibited during the hours between 8:00 am and 6:00 pm.

3. Obligation to Fix Leaks, Breaks or Malfunctions

All leaks, breaks, or other malfunctions in the customer’s plumbing fixtures and/or irrigation system must be repaired within **three (3) business days** of written notification by DOWC, unless other arrangements are made with DOWC. “Written notification” includes door tags and Eye on Water notifications.

4. Prohibited Uses of Water

- a. The application of potable water to driveways and sidewalks
- b. The use of potable water in a water feature, except where the water is part of a recirculating system
- c. The application of potable water to outdoor landscapes during and within forty-eight (48) hours after measurable rainfall
- d. The serving of drinking water other than upon request in eating or drinking establishments
- e. Irrigation outside of newly constructed buildings with potable water inconsistent with regulations
- f. Filling/refilling ornamental lakes or ponds with potable water
- g. Covers are required for all pools and spas
- h. Car washing is only permitted at commercial car washes with recirculation systems or high pressure/low volume wash systems

Other duly adopted restrictions on the use of potable water as prescribed from time to time by the Commission or other authorized government agencies may be added at any time.

Please remember that the following are ALWAYS prohibited:

- The application of potable water to landscapes in a manner that causes runoff to other areas
- The use of a hose that dispenses potable water to wash any vehicles, aircraft, or trailers, except where the hose is fitted with a shut-off nozzle
- Using broken or defective plumbing or irrigation after DOWC has notified you to repair it
- Using outdoor irrigation during and 48 hours following measurable precipitation
- Using potable water in decorative water features that do not recirculate the water
- Using potable water to wash sidewalks & driveways
